Re: "Judgement for Dismantling of the BLUE LADY and "irreversibility""

Dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I am the Vice President & General Manager of Titan Salvage. We are a division of Crowley Maritime Corporation. Titan is a dedicated global marine salvage and wreck removal company, which derives all of its revenues from this type of work.

We respectfully request the Prime Minister's Office to review the Supreme Courts conclusion in regards to the situation faced with the apparent beaching of the famous ocean liner SS Norway (ex-SS France and now Blue Lady) and subsequent ruling made to break the vessel.

We understand that the primary reason the court has ruled in favor of breaking the vessel, in its current position, is because there is a belief that the vessel can not be removed from where it now rests. This is not the case. We have the capability and expertise to refloat the vessel.

Please allow us to present to the Prime Minister and India's Court our credentials, history and experience that there is actually very high probability that the BLUE LADY is not at all in an "irreversible" position, as the esteemed Court has found.
